Our ministry in East Africa with Edgewood is growing rapidly. We are very encouraged by the progress in our pastor training ministry in partnership with the Third Mill Institute. RUF has been established on one campus and we are encouraged about the prospects to expand to additional campuses over the next 3 years. Our impact in the area of economic development is also beginning to bear fruit through a missional agri-business project (called RECSN) that we have helped to launch in Northern Uganda. We continue to train and mentor church planters in Uganda and South Sudan.
