4. Questions for discussion

How do we show compassion for the intersex, without giving any quarter to the idea that one can change their sex?

- Definitions:
 - Intersex describes a small percentage of people who are affected by a congenital disorder of sexual development, such that they do not have a fully functioning reproductive system.
 - o Gender dysphoria the condition of feeling one's emotional and psychological identity to be at variance with one's birth sex

How do we respond to a teenage girl who would now rather be a boy? Who is working with us and who is working against us? What happens when they turn 18?
How do we look for and address the underlying issue for many? How do we spot and defend against the spirit of the age: expressive individualism?
