- **A.** Christ obeyed the whole law for his people, and then suffered the punishment due for their sins.

Why these? The verses and catechism remind us that 1) The Son of God took to himself a human nature to be able to suffer and die, 2) That he led a sinless life, and 3) The life he led was full of suffering, and he died a shameful death. See Westminister Shorter Catechism 19-22.

Why these? The verses and catechism remind us that 1) Jesus' death satisfies God's wrath, 2) Our justification before God is a forgiveness of sins and imputation (accounting) of righteousness, and 3) God continues to work in us (sanctification), conforming us to Christ. See Westminister Shorter Catechism 22/33/35.
